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
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From the Principal's desk



- We introduced online admission in 2013 and our system of admission and fees collection continues throughout the year for 1st year 2nd year and 3rd year in our own server
- 2. We have our own SMS gateway in 2013 for communicating with students in the rural hinterlands of Sunderbans
- 3. Campus was made wifi enabled in 2014
- 4. Introduced Biometric Attendance for teachers and staff in 2014 and all teachers including the part time teachers stay back in the college from 10 AM to 4 PM a practice since 2014 which is unparallel in the state of West Bengal
- 5. Aimed to earn the status of College with Potential for Excellence in 2015
- 6. Introduced digital attendance tracking system for students in 2017 –only college in West Bengal to do so

The college has a de-politicised campus


The college believes that if excellence is to be achieved than the campus should be made free from the intervention of Students Union controlled by "non-students" and "outsiders"



College Attendance Management System

- An Innovation

The college provides a barcoded I card to each student during the time of admission



This card helps the college to track students' attendance during the arrival time and the departure time and their college attendance as well as arrival and departure time remains recorded and uploaded in the college attendance portal http://dailyroster.co.in

The objective of this practice is to track class attendance of students through digital devices and appropriate attendance report can be obtained in accordance to customised search criteria




These days, students – in almost all colleges - are showing lesser propensity to come to classes and rely more on tutoring, suggestion based preparation and rote learning. This college is no exception to this trend. However we are committed to change the trend and **BRING STUDENTS BACK TO CLASSROOM** – an academic movement that might set example to others in the years to come. Our initiatives include

- Uniform Arrival Uniform Departure of All Teachers All teachers and staff arrive at 10 AM and stays back till 4 PM throughout the year.
- **Increasing number of Direct Teaching Days** Number of direct teaching days have increased from 120 to 190 in recent times

Steps taken to increase class attendance

- Attendance Scholarship Rs 2000/- is provided to students having 75% class attendance
- **Restriction on stipend benefits** Irregular students not having 50% class attendance is barred from applying for students stipend / Kanyashree
- Back to back classes The routine is so designed for a student that his or her classes gets completed within two to three hours and he or she is free to move away from the college after class hours.
- Add-on Benefits The college provides several benefits during college hours
 - ◆ 35 terminal computer centre (CPE funding)
 - ◆ Internet surfing from 8 terminals (CPE funding)
 - Entry to Services centre providing Books for Competitive Examinations (COC funding)
 - ♦ English Language Laboratory (CPE funding)
- Attendance Monitoring -
 - ♦ Attendance traking through biometric tracker
 - ◆ CCTV surveillance in the classrooms across each period
 - ◆ Parent Teachers Meeting are held as and when necessary
- **Mentoring of Students** Students meet the teachers in the Seminar Library reading room (5000 sq feet) beyond class hours for any guidance necessary
- · Continuous internal assessment system introduced
- · Audit of monthly attendence record of students
- Introduction of monthly progress report card for the students









Development 2016-2018

Renovation of the College under RUSA grant (MHRD)

Pre RUSA - 2016

Water logging on the 10000 sq ft roof top of the college and seepage of roof water into the main building was causing damage to the building, the science laboratories below the roof, damage to the walls and the electrical wirings leading to short circuit and fire and damage of properties



Post RUSA - 2017

RUSA renovation grant was utilized towards

- 1. Truss roofing of the entire 10000 square feet college main building
- 2. Major repair of walls, floors, doors, windows, bathrooms
- 3. and the renovation of the electrical distribution panel and the wiring

Outcome

- 1. The college main building is free from water logging and seepage giving a fresh lease of life to the college main building
- 2. Renovated walls, floors, doors and windows give fresh look to the 62 years old college building
- 3. The old college building is now free from possible threat of short circuits.



New Construction in the College under RUSA grant (MHRD)

Pre RUSA - Old Library Building & Reading Room

The age old college library building is in very bad shape and showing cracks and fissures and thus do not have any future beyond three to five years. Also the present library is not large enough to accommodate new books and journals and the reading room space is also highly inadequate.



Post RUSA - New Library Building and Reading Room

RUSA New Construction grant has been utilized towards construction of a two storeyed building (totalling an area of 10000 sq ft)

The College is placed near to the Sunderbans, and students who come to this college are generally 1st generation learners and therefore have very little opportunity to read books in their homes. The vision of this reading room is therefore to encourage the students to read books – text books, reference books and also other books - which they have not read in their childhood.

The college therefore looks forward where teachers would read books and inspire the students to read books in a mentor-mentee environment.
